What is Bezos Academy?

Bezos Academy is a network of high-quality, tuition-free, Montessori-inspired preschools located in spaces provided by community partners across the nation. We offer programming five days a week for children at no cost to eligible families. Each classroom can hold up to 20 students and is staffed with one lead teacher and two assistant teachers.

What is the schedule?

Bezos Academy provides full-day preschool. Bezos Academy does not offer partial week or part-time enrollment and expects families who enroll their children to commit to full-time preschool. Children should arrive by the start of instructional hours and stay until the end unless otherwise noted on the school calendar. Hours and summer programming will vary by location.

Are meals served at Bezos Academy?

We provide multiple nutritious meals and healthy snacks for all students throughout the school day.

Are Bezos Academy teachers credentialed?

Each classroom's lead teacher meets their state's requirements for early childhood teachers and has earned a Primary Montessori credential. All school staff also receive continuous training and development throughout the school year.

What curriculum is used?

At Bezos Academy, the child is at the center of every decision we make. Our Montessori-inspired curriculum meets every child where they are and prioritizes all areas of development. We use research-based standards to track developmental milestones and inform individualized instruction.

What are the eligibility requirements?

To be eligible to apply for the 2025-26 school year, your child must be three or four years old by September 1, 2025, and your family must have a household income that is up to 400% of the Federal Poverty Level. For additional information on income eligibility, visit bezosacademy.org/eligibility.

What is the admission process?

Bezos Academy holds an annual lottery for available seats. All eligible families are welcome to apply. Families will be notified after the lottery if their child is extended an offer. If you apply after the lottery date, your child will either receive a seat or be waitlisted, depending on if we have filled the seats in the school.

Will my family be charged a fee for attending?
